 Wisconsin Child Psychiatry Consultation Program (WI CPCP) Updates Report progress on action items from last CAC meeting (see attachment) State map of regions with WI CPCP staff & consultants (see attachment) 	Dr. Weinert described the lack of MBH education in her residency training. Suggestion to connect further with faculty preceptors/attending physicians to utilize WI CPCP. There are attending PCPs in training programs who do not feel comfortable addressing MBH conditions and therefore do not provide trainees with experience in those areas.
FY 22 Focus: Supporting PCPs; Education Strategy Development WI CPCP Education Strategies 	 Dr. Kim described education development with case conference series and online education modules. She asked for input for improving WI CPCP education. Discussion: Provide cheat sheets, quick reference tools to print Limit time (~20 min) in clinical settings. Record sessions and post link. Residencies may share strategies for online learning. Education targeted for clinic RNs to assist when triaging patients and family. Similarly, education targeted for MBH therapists.
How can WI CPCP support PCPs better?	 Assistance for PCPs bridging the gap when working with complex MH needs in children waiting to see a psychiatrist. Develop cheat sheets Provide family resources
