### Introductions & Committee Business

News from members' practices and organizations:

- Karen Katz – OCMH convened a Youth Summit in April which was attended by hundreds of youth wellness program representatives from 47 schools across the state. Student Voice materials produced following the event can be found on their website [OCMH](#)
- Tessa Vance – WWHF continues to expand and improve the Youth Wellness Hub and will soon have Spanish language access available. [Youth Wellness Hub](#)
- Scott Radtke – Catalpa was recently recognized by two law enforcement agencies for their success in providing next-day follow-ups with families to connect them with services after MBH needs were identified during law enforcement visits.
- Bethany Weinert – Children's Wisconsin has implemented PCP supports in the form of integrate BH consultants in each clinic and pharmacy check-ins with families two weeks post-initiation of new medications.
- Heidi Massey – A recent DHS Title 5 (MCH) state-wide health needs assessment highlighted mental health needs. Funding opportunities to address the need have been created. Also, the recently passed state budget continues to fully support WI CPCP.

### Wisconsin Child Psychiatry Consultation Program (WI CPCP) Updates

PMHPC Conference set for Friday, November 7, 2025. CAC members receive complimentary registration. Four expert speakers will be addressing the topics of: Community Response Across the Spectrum of Psychosis, Next Steps with Suicidal Patients in the Office, Advanced Psychopharmacology, and Decoding and Treating Nicotine and Cannabis Use Disorders.

The WI CPCP team is working on revitalizing check-in meetings, which ideally occur annually with every clinic enrolled in WI CPCP. After 12 years of operations, the program continues to look at ways to improve our engagement with and value to enrolled PCPs.

### Discussion

WI CPCP clinic staff education

- Angela Lunn noted that RNs at her clinic have taken online modules created by WI CPCP's psychiatric nurse and found them to be valuable.

Pediatric primary care workflow changes (anticipated or already experienced) related to impending cuts to Medicaid and other federal actions:

- Bethany Weinert - more vaccine refusals and general mistrust. Doctor-patient/family relationships built over time are eroding.
- Andrea Chao - spends more time getting families to accept vaccines.
- Tessa Vance- Well Badger now receives more calls from people with concerns about losing health coverage.

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- Angela Lunn – a rush of patients seeking treatment/vaccines before benefits are taken away along with undocumented patients wanting to pay in cash to try to avoid creating any trail of their presence.
- Karen Katz – partner agency, Acceptional Minds, has families turning down autism screening amid worries that their children might be listed in a national database that could lead to negative consequences.
- Readiness for possible ICE visits to clinics varied among the group; Angela Lunn’s FQHC fully prepared with a system for ICE visit management and Bethany Weinert having no information from her health system on the matter.
- Scott Radtke – “What’s Next for Medicaid” one-hour panel discussion was held in Madison yesterday. Wisconsin’s Medicaid Director was on the panel, which was recorded by WisconsinEye (news outlet) and is available for viewing via their website.

### Autism diagnosis:

- Rosa Kim reviewed the various existing barriers to broadening the pool of health care professionals whose diagnose of autism is acceptable to insurance and, therefore, treatment providers.
- Several members affirmed that schools do a separate educational autism determination, which does not always align with the medical diagnosis.
